 1 Bread is usually baked in a large piece that's called a loaf. If you buy a loaf, it is then cut into slices ready for eating.
 • You can buy a loaf that is already sliced.
 2 People also make bread in small pieces that are usually round in shape called rolls. The round flat piece of bread in which you often eat a burger is called a bun.

 A biscuit is like a small thin cake, usually round, hard and sweet.
 • Would you like a biscuit?
 • Last night Steve ate a whole packet of biscuits.

LANGUAGE HELP
 In America a biscuit is called a cookie.

 A burger is made of meat (usually beef) that is cut up into very small pieces and made into a flat round shape.
 I went to the fast food restaurant and asked for a burger and French fries.
 • Another word for a burger is a hamburger.

bun /bʌn/ /bʌn/
 A bun is a small round piece of bread that is used for cooking.
 • If you are hungry, have some bread and butter.
 • The steak had been fried in butter.

LANGUAGE HELP
 Bread and butter is a slice of bread with butter on it.

bread /brɛd/ /brɛd/
 Bread is a type of food made from flour and water that is mixed together and baked in an oven.

butter /ˈbʌtə/ /ˈbʌtə/
 Butter is a yellow fat that is made from milk or cream. You can spread butter on bread or use it for cooking.

bun /bʌn/ /bʌn/
 A bun is a small round piece of bread that is used for cooking.

 • I made a trip on the train to see my brother.
 • Did you have a nice trip?
